GRAMPIAN CLASSIC MOTORCYCLE CLUB CAIRN O' MOUNT RUN; SUNDAY 12th MAY 2024

The Grampian Classic Motorcycle Club invites GCMCC members, non-members, and members of the VMCC and of ACU/SACU affiliated clubs, to the forty second Cairn O'Mount Run. The event will be open to **ALL motorcycles, sidecar outfits, tricycles and three-wheeled tri-cars** although judging for Concours d'Elegance will be restricted to those vehicles which were manufactured before **31st December 2003**.

The Entry Fee is £20-00 for riders and £17-50 for passengers which includes:

BACON ROLL, TEA OR COFFEE ON ARRIVAL, PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE AND AFTERNOON TEA, WITH TEA OR COFFEE AT THE FINISH.

The run will include main roads, country lanes and some steep ascents. The run will start from the **TOR NA COILLE HOTEL** in Banchory (01330 822242) on the main A93 road just to the west of Banchory (AB31 4AB). **Entrants are requested to meet from 10.00 onwards**. Entrants will need to sign on at the point of arrival in the Tor na Coille Hotel prior to participating in the run.

Please enter no later than 4th May 2024. No entries will be accepted on the day. Concours judging (in the categories which are listed below) will take place before the first machine departs at 11.00. Note that machines should depart in order of age with the oldest leaving first.

There will be a lunch stop along the route. **The cost of lunch is not included in the entry fee.** The run will end back at the **TOR NA COILLE HOTEL** where the prize giving ceremony will be held at approximately 4.00pm.

The approximate length of the full run is 80 to 100 miles. Response to any breakdowns is the responsibility of the entrant.

ENTRY CATEGORIES

The awards, which are listed below will be given only to those eligible machines that have attempted to take part in the run. All awards are given at the discretion of the organisers of the run and there can be no appeal against their decisions. Award winners will receive certificates to keep. The original Shield Trophies will be retained by the club for safekeeping after the prizegiving ceremony.

Machines will be judged in the following Concours D'Elegance categories :-

VINTAGE - Manufactured prior to 31st December 1930 (The Silver Family Shield).

POST VINTAGE - Made between 1st January 1931 and 31st December 1944 (Davie Wilson Shield).

POST WAR - Made between 1st January 1945 and 31st December 1959 (Silver Brothers Shield).

CLASSIC - Manufactured between 1st January 1960 and 31st December 1978 (The Welgrave Timber Systems Shield).

MODERN CLASSIC - Manufactured between 1st January 1979 and 31st December 2003 (Trophy kindly donated by N. Forrest).

BEST TRIUMPH - Best Triumph machine in the event (The Edward Turner Shield).

BEST JAPANESE - Best Japanese machine in the event (Andrew Mackie Shield)

The following Awards will also be presented:-

DISTANCE AWARD (The Chevron Trophy) - Awarded to the rider of an eligible machine who is judged to have travelled the furthest distance to the event, by the shortest distance from home, riding a machine which is entered, and which is eligible for the event. Note - this award is restricted to those eligible machines that were manufactured before 31st December 1980.

OLDEST MACHINE / RIDER (The Ian Campbell Shield) - Awarded to the machine/rider combination whose combined age in years is the greatest of those entered in the event.

YOUNGEST RIDER / OLDEST MACHINE (The David Moffat Shield) - Awarded to the rider whose machine has the greatest difference in age to his/her own age in years.

JIM SILVER MEMORIAL SHIELD - Awarded to the machine that records the highest number of votes as “best machine” when judged by all entrants in the event.

Machines listed on the entry form may only be substituted for other machines with the consent of the event organisers.

In the event of a tie for any award, the result will be determined by considering the older of the machines that have tied, to be the winner of the award. In certain cases, permanent trophies may be awarded at the discretion of the organisers. This will be made clear during the award ceremony. Ordinarily the trophies will be held at all times by the GCMCC for safe keeping and to arrange the annual engraving.

LEGAL REQUIREMENTS - All entrants are required to comply with the legal requirements specified on the entry form and the sign in sheet.

Closing date for entries is the **4th May 2024**. No refunds will be made after the closing date.
